President's Message

Already? Are you kidding me? A year is gone ALREADY? Yikes! I can't tell you all how gratifying it has been to serve as President of this prestigious chapter for 2008...The current Board of Directors truly deserves kudos for their dedication and sense of long-range planning in making this chapter better...

I know, I know, I seemed a little irritated just a few short months ago and I was, but all that is in the rear-view mirror as the concrete industry here in Southern California is staring straight into one of its most challenging recessionary markets ever. Just as I had some really good help from many active ACI members this year the concrete business will need to work together to help each other get through 2009.

In this economy our industry has to be creative, very smart and continually on point: in other words we are all forced to look at our day-to-day products and operations and think about how we can innovate and refine them while being responsible industry members. Many changes and innovations could be quick, but are they responsible? Do they affect others in the business in a negative way or do they create a better product, and in the long term is the innovation good for the industry and does it make the producer a profit?

Sometimes change sounds so easy...but many in our business find innovation a really hard thing to implement. After all, we have specifications and expectations of our customers to be concerned with and we have to know our refinements will satisfy these everyday demands. I've said this to many of you individually but I think it bears repeating here: **no one** is going down to the local Target for 25 yards of concrete...they need to call an expert manufacturer for what they need and you, in turn, need to provide a product that makes you a profit while performing in an acceptable and predictable manner. Some concrete experts are forging niches with their creative innovations unheard of just a couple of years ago that have dramatic potential. (Remember our concrete demo in October? Where was pervious concrete in 2006? Where was 40% SCM in block wall grout in 2007?)

Now as an industry expert people call you over and over for what you produce and I have to think that you need to use your expertise to refine and squeeze every nickel of profit out of every unit of your product. And after the nickels get pushed out and accounted for you probably are looking for another two or three cents per unit for your work and expertise, and you should. How you get that "little extra" is totally dependent on your refinements and innovations, many of which OTHER experts in this industry are actually doing, reviewing or expanding on for their benefit when they get called. The marketing of these innovations and refinements to end users that **want** "new and improved" instead of "same old" is a void that only a few brave producers have ventured into.

At the simplest level just ask yourself "is this mix using materials and procedures that make that "little extra" or not?" It doesn't matter if it is a block mix, a back yard footing, a pre-cast anything mix or a HPC Caltrans mix, each and every one can stand a little innovation, and the tools are staring right at you and your company.

So, how's your concrete?
